
Most users are migrating from Windows rather than Mac or Chrome OS.







- **Visual Noise:** OS interface treated as ad inventory.
- **The Verdict:** "Windows 10 was the last good Windows."

The Original Sin:

Decisions made to rush DirectX integration crippled the security layer to allow faster hardware access.

This 'broken for greed' architecture created a permanent vulnerability, necessitating the existence of the entire third-party antivirus industry to patch a fundamentally flawed foundation.



The Web-App Revolution: 90% of modern workflow tools (Slack, Zoom, Figma, Salesforce) run in the browser, making the underlying OS irrelevant.


Community Support Model
